MINUTES OF THE SWINFEN AND PACKINGTON PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD AT THE CONFERENCE CENTRE, HMP SWINFEN ON WEDNESDAY 13 JULY 2022 COMMENCING AT 6.00 PM

PRESENT

Councillor Dyott in the Chair Councillors Loescher and Mrs Pope

In attendance:

Ms J Minor, Parish Clerk Six members of the public

PARISH FORUM

Residents off the Swinfen Estate raised several concerns, firstly, the retention of a marquee at the Swinfen Hall Hotel [planning application 22/00915/FULM] due to the increase in noise. They explained that there had been an increase in vehicular traffic using The Drive [passing residential properties] which leads to the service road since planning application 21/01570/FULM [Various renovation works including the conversion of staff accommodation and outdoor bothies to create 9 new hotel rooms, 2 holiday cottages and the construction of 12 No. lakeside chalets, demolition of agricultural structures, erection of 1 No. two storey hotel block comprising 12 hotel rooms, 1 No. two storey hotel block comprising 7 hotel rooms, and a hotel leisure complex comprising spa with treatment rooms, gym, indoor/outdoor pool facilities and restaurant, extension of car park, erection of an entrance gate and all associated works and landscaping across the site] had been granted. The Parish Clerk explained that the Parish Council was a "consultee" and advised the residents to upload their views onto LDC's planning portal however Councillors stated that they would take into account the residents views when considering the application.

Secondly, they referred to the lack of play equipment on the field and that the fencing around the field, in part, needed repairing. Thirdly, a resident referred to the lack of a bus service however, they were informed that a bus service did run along the A38 for approximately 12 months but due to lack of use was cancelled. Fourthly, a resident asked if pedestrian access over the A38 could be provided. Fifthly, they referred to street lighting on the Estate and the fact that some were not working. The Parish Clerk explained that their concerns were not under the direct jurisdiction of the Parish Council and advised the residents to write to the Governor of the Prison and Staffordshire County Council, as Highway Authority.

Following the concerns raised by residents, it was **AGREED** that the Parish Clerk would email the Governor of the Prison concerning the residents' concerns.

19. THE HIGH-SPEED RAIL PLANS

Tamworth Road Ecological Mitigation Site

Councillor Dyott referred to the email received from Balfour Beatty Vinci [BBV] who were starting to consult with the local community regarding the ecological mitigation site off Tamworth Road, currently being used as a stockpile area. They were asking if there were any environmental groups in Swinfen however they were more than happy for the Parish Council to be involved in these discussions.

RESOLVED That the following email be sent to Aoinne Conway of BBV:

Members confirmed that the Parish Council is not aware of any environmental groups in Swinfen, however, the Parish Council would like to be involved in these discussions and kept updated with the proposed consultations. The Parish Council is mindful that the area is scheduled to be heathland habitat creation (woodland and grassland) in accordance with the plan. The local community at Botany are having to suffer noise and visual impact while the site is used as materials holding area and as such the local community would like to be assured that the eventual environmental mitigation is adequate.

21. RESURFACING THE CAR PARKS AT HOPWAS WOODS NEXT TO THE A51

Councillor Loescher informed Members that he had produced the following proposal.

The Project

The project is to improve the car-parking provision at Hopwas Woods Car Parks next to the A51 at Packington.

The informal car parking at Hopwas Woods next to the A51 has become increasingly busy (especially since the Pandemic) as local communities seek to access Hopwas Woods, the local countryside, the Heart of England Way and the local canal network. The current carpark is a stoned area with parking for around 30 vehicles. The carparking facility is currently poorly surfaced and spasmodically maintained by Lichfield District Council (LDC). The local countryside had already suffered to the creating of the HS2 railway through the area. The proposal is to resurface the car parking area at Hopwas Woods. This would involve the following:

- Completely re-grade the area
- Putting on a new surface (tarmac, gravel or another suitable pervious vehicle proof surface.)
- Putting appropriate drainage especially, to prevent run-off onto A51
- Creating necessary curbing to A51.
- Putting in appropriate signage and bins etc

The project could also include creating new walking routes with appropriate signage.

Benefits

The benefits of the project if delivered are:

- Improving access to Hopwas Woods for local communities.
- Improving access Heart of England Way for local communities.

• Improving access to local countryside and canal network for local communities.

- Potentially Increasing tourism in an area
- Providing an opportunity for HS2 Ltd and BBV to put something back into one the parishes worst affected by HS2.

• Improving local access to countryside to "balance" negative impacts of HS2.

• Improve the local perception of HS2 Ltd and BBV

Constraints

The following are seen as constraints:

- Funding (the Parish Council has very limited funds).
- Involvement and agreement of land- owners (see below)

• involvement and agreement of appropriate authorities (Highways, LDC and SSC)

• Management resources.

These constraints are detailed further below.

Finance

It is anticipated that any scheme would in excess of $\pounds 250k$. The following could be approached for funding:

- HS2 Community Environment Fund (CEF)
- BLEF
- Lichfield District Council (LDC)
- Staffs County Council (SCC)
- Highways Agency

Land Ownership

The owned by:

- Robert Mercer
- John Barnes

The land owners have been approached by the Parish Council and are supportive of the scheme subject to appropriate legal agreements and safeguards.

Management Resources

Swinfen and Packington Parish Council is a very small parish council with a limited budget and only 6 voluntary unpaid members. Swinfen and Parish Council does not have the necessary resources to achieve the following: o Properly "Champion" the scheme and make the necessary applications for funding. o Co-ordinate the appropriate authorities. o Project manage the scheme.

Assistance would need to be sought and forthcoming from SCC, LDC, HS2 and BBV.

BBV have agreed to organise a focussed session to go through the CEF application involving CEF advisor from Groundwork, Staffs County Council, Highways and Lichfield District Council

RESOLVED That the following email be sent to Andy Debell of BBV; Aoinne Conway of BBV and David Emery of BBV:

When members of the Parish Council met with BBV at Cappers Lane, we discussed the proposal to obtain funding for the resurfacing the carparks at Hopwas Woods next to the A51. There two action points relevant that came out of the meeting:

• BBV - to organise a focussed session to go through the CEF application, involve CEF advisor from Groundwork, Staffs highway and Lichfield District Council.

• Parish Council - PC to agree the focus of project

We have prepared the attached document.

There is some concern on the Parish Council as regards the time and management this project would take on behalf of the PC.

As highlighted in the paper, Swinfen and Packington Parish Council is a very small parish council with a limited budget and only 6 voluntary unpaid members. Swinfen and Parish Council does not have the necessary resources to achieve the following:

• Properly "Champion" the scheme and make the necessary applications for funding.

- Co-ordinate the appropriate authorities.
- Project manage the scheme.

Assistance would need to be sought and forthcoming from SCC, LDC, HS2 and BBV.

22. PLANNING APPLICATION 22/00915/FULM – MR LEE BUSHELL SWINFEN HALL HOTEL, THE DRIVE RETENTION OF MARQUEE
